Pet Rescue Pilots® is a Los Angeles based non-profit network that helps with the immediate needs of pet relocation by air. Soaring on the wings of your generosity, we coordinate with multiple local rescue organizations to transport pets from overcrowded rural shelters of California and land them in the loving arms of rescue groups, foster families, and forever homes across the west coast of the United States and Canada.

Humane and efficient, rescue by air means saving more pets over a greater distance in less time. Carrying as many as 72 pets to safety in one flight, we turn a 16 hour drive from California to Oregon into just a 3 hour flight. And we are landing results.

On the ground, Pet Rescue Pilots® is as committed to taking small steps as we are champions for big change. PRP advocates for responsible pet guardianship and shaping long-term solutions through education and legislation for managing the number of homeless pets. Chief Rescue Pilot Julian Javor participates in local government and speaking engagements regarding these issues.

Our efforts are fueled by donations, corporate, and private support. Only together will we reach our ultimate destination: a world where every pet lives a happy life in a safe and loving home.

RESCUE BY RELOCATION SM FROM HOMELESS TO HOPEFUL

Approximately 1 million pets are euthanized in US shelters every year due to lack of space. A handful of states account for over 70% of this number, California being one of them.

By contrast, areas like the Pacific Northwest and British Columbia don't have enough animals in their shelters to accommodate the number of families looking to adopt rescue pets. And while California struggles with overcrowded shelters in rural areas, Southern California's metropolitan cities have more adoption applications than they have rescue pets to fill them.

By simply relocating these pets via air, our rescue network is able to get them adopted into loving forever homes within 2 weeks of arrival. We call this "Rescue by Relocation."

Fueled by donations, corporate, and private support, we can rise above these numbers en route to a world where every pet has a loving, forever home.

GOING THE DISTANCE TO SAVE HOMELESS PETS

FROM CENTRAL CALIFORNIA TO PACIFIC NORTHWEST & CANADA

We create life-saving space in local shelters by flying pets out of overcrowded facilities in rural areas in California where they have a slim chance at being adopted, landing them in the Pacific Northwest and western Canada, where rescue groups do not have enough rescue pets to meet the number of open adoption applications.

FROM NM/AZ/TX TO SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA

We fly pets out of rural areas in New Mexico, Arizona, and Texas where lack of spaying and neutering leads to exponential increases in pet homelessness, and overcrowded shelters with as little as 48 hour holds contribute to high euthanasia rates, landing them in Southern California where there are more families looking to adopt than there are rescue pets available for adoption.




THE EXTRA MILE

- Our partners are required to spay/neuter and provide basic health care and vaccines prior to boarding with us.
- All the pets we transport have vetted foster and adoption families upon arrival; they never go from shelter to shelter.

NOTHING IS MORE PRECIOUS THAN OUR CARGO

We go the distance to help pets in need, because we believe every pet deserves to know a loving home. That's why we have spent over 700 hours in the air, landed in more than 100 airports up and down the west coast, and traveled over 134,000 miles to help give 1,495 pets and counting a second chance at a forever home. Here are a few of their stories.



COURAGEOUS CHRISTOPHER
MISSION #85
Calaveras, CA >> Eugene, OR

Christopher was at a shelter in central California where he was given a 24-hour countdown to euthanasia due to major damage to his jaw, which was broken in three places. After being pulled by our rescue network, Christopher was rushed to the orthopedic surgeon to receive much needed care.

Flight Plan: Once Christopher had recovered and was ready to fly, he joined PRP on a flight with 29 other pets en route to Eugene, Oregon, where he was given the life he deserves.

Final Destination: His jaw may be a little wonky, but his forever family in Oregon says that doesn't stop him from dancing on his hind legs and being absolutely endearing to all who meet him.



MAMA JOSIE
MISSION #44
Ramona, CA >> Henderson, NV

A very pregnant mama-to-be, Josie was pulled from a shelter in central California so she wouldn't deliver in an overcrowded facility, running the risk of her newborn pups being euthanized due to lack of space.

Flight Plan: A rescue group was willing to care for Josie and her pups, but the drive was too long, too expensive, and too dangerous for a pregnant dog. PRP swooped in and flew Josie to Nevada.

Final Destination: Josie safely birthed her litter in St. George, Utah, and she and her puppies were all adopted to vetted, loving homes.
